

Stellenbosch Vineyard snapped up by US Tycoon



Mulderbosch Vineyard situated in the prime Koelenhof area of Stellenbosch has been bought by the Californian Investment Group Terroir Capital. Previously an owner of the Highly successful Californian Winery, Screaming Eagle, Charles Banks head of Terroir Capital Group said they have been eager to invest in South Africa after their first visit to the Cape in 2008.

“We are convinced of the immense global potential of fine South African wine and are truly excited about the opportunity to build on the tremendous Mulderbosch legacy and enhance the already Stellar reputation of this great brand” Banks remarked

Mulderbosch was recently invited to participate in Wine Spectator's first-ever "New World Wine Experience" as well as the elite Davos du Vin conference in Lake Como, Italy.
